How to report Coronavirus Scams:

- Contact the U.S. Department of Justice's <u>National Elder Fraud Hotline</u> at 833-FRAUD-11 (833-372-8311). The hotline is staffed by counselors and case managers everyday from 6am to 11pm.
- File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission. Reports go into the FTC's Consumer Sentinel Database and are shared with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. (Data from Coronavirus-related consumer complaints submitted to the FTC is available at ftc.gov/exploredata).
- Adult Protective Services and Older Americans Act legal assistance programs can also support people who have been targeted by scams. Find your local programs using the <u>Eldercare Locator</u>.
- If it is a cyber scam, <u>file an Internet Crime Complaint with the FBI</u>.
- If you have encountered a coronavirus scam and the U.S. Mail[®] has been used in any way, the United States Postal Inspection Service wants to help. <u>Please report the crime</u> <u>using their online form</u>.
